CURRENT SITUATION

Current Situation:	<p>For today, weak southwesterly/ onshore winds are expected to develop across the incident. With this wind shift, temperatures will be a bit cooler this afternoon and minimum relative humidity will be a bit higher. Firefighting resources will pursue opportunities to build and improve direct line to minimize further perimeter growth and support containment objectives. Fire suppression repair teams are actively engaged working around the fire perimeter and affected areas.</p> <p>Ventura County Department of Toxic Substance Control Community Update Here: https://tinyurl.com/woolseyssf</p> <p>[†]Preliminary estimates show 483 total structures destroyed which accounts for nonresidential commercial property and minor structures.
