<b>Current Situation:</b>	<p>Emergency and utility crews continue to work in areas affected by the fire. Please use caution when driving in and around the area.</p> <p>Winds are expected to drop below critical level tonight.</p> <p>The Angeles National Forest has elevated its fire danger level to EXTREME. Fire restrictions are now in effect throughout the Forest to include: NO CAMPFIREs, NO OPEN FLAME, NO BBQ's or GRILLING. <b>Road Closures:</b>	<p>All road closures have been lifted <b>EXCEPT:</b> Santiago Estates and Little Tujunga from Middle Ranch to Live Oak Campground, which is <b>OPEN TO RESIDENTS ONLY.</b></p> <p>Residents are not allowed to park on roadways due to emergency traffic. Vehicles must be parked in driveways or designated parking areas.</p>
